



WV-VA Pipeline Monitoring Program Training



TU and its West Virginia and Virginia Councils have partnered with the WV Rivers and Ohio Valley Environmental Coalition (OVEC) to train volunteers to monitor water resources that have the potential to be impacted by natural gas pipeline development. The goal of this workshop is to train volunteers to effectively monitor water quality on high priority streams along proposed pipeline routes before, during and after potential pipeline construction. The WV-VA Pipeline Monitoring Program is an objective data collection effort and does not engage in advocacy-related activities.
