




## What are "Headwaters"?

"Headwater streams are the smallest parts of river and stream networks, but make up the majority of river miles in the United States. They are the part of rivers furthest from the river's endpoint or confluence with another stream."

## Mon Forest "Headwaters"?

Rivers like the Potomac, Greenbrier, Elk, Tygart, Cheat, and Gauley all have their origins in the Mon Forest. These rivers combine with others to flow into the Chesapeake and Ohio Watersheds – 9% of people in the US can trace the source of their drinking water to the Mon Forest Headwaters.




Pocahontas County alone is the source for **eight** rivers: Cherry, Cranberry, Elk, Gauley, Greenbrier, Tygart, Williams, and Shavers Fork of the Cheat River.

What recreation users said about Headwaters

"Virtually all participants were concerned about the future of Mon Forest waterways. Anglers, kayakers, and backpackers alike all recognized the waters of the Mon as the cleanest in the state, thanks to the efforts of the US Forest Service. However, they expressed concern that this care is limited to the prescriptions provided in the [forest] management plan, which can be changed"


# What are some of the questions we are asking?

The US Forest service has designated 12 Mon Forest waterway segments as being free-flowing, having a outstanding remarkable value, and eligible for designation as a Wild & Scenic River:

North Fork of the Cherry







## Continue the status quo (Forest Service management)

As the recreation users stated, can be changed in future Forest Plans

Forest Service at any time can declare the waterway "unsuitable" and release it from care

#### A Presidential designation

Monument or similar designation

May change recreation uses and local control

#### A Congressional designation

Long process, concerns about local control
Bluestone – Wild and Scenic River
WVU The Bridge Initiative *Headwaters Legacy Act*
