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### **Independent Accountant's Review Report**

To the Board of Directors of West Virginia Rivers Coalition, Inc. Charleston, West Virginia

We have reviewed the accompanying financial statements of West Virginia Rivers Coalition, Inc. (a nonprofit organization), which comprise the statement of financial position as of December 31, 2024, and the related statements of activities and cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements. A review includes primarily applying analytical procedures to management's financial data and making inquiries of entity management. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit, the objective of which is the expression of an opinion regarding the financial statements as a whole. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion.

#### Note A – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

<u>Nature of Operations</u> - West Virginia Rivers Coalition, Inc. is a non-stock nonprofit corporation. The Organization is the statewide voice for water-based recreation and clean drinkable, swimmable, and fishable rivers and streams from the headwaters to wherever water flows in West Virginia.

<u>Basis of Accounting</u> - The financial statements have been prepared on the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

<u>Income Taxes</u> - The West Virginia Rivers Coalition, Inc. is a nonprofit corporation under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and is exempt from income taxes from its nonprofit activities. The Internal Revenue Service has classified the organization as a non-profit that is not a private foundation.

Management has determined that the company does not have any uncertain tax positions and associated unrecognized benefits that materially impact the financial statements or related disclosures. Because tax matters are subject to some degree of uncertainty, there can be no assurance that the company's tax returns will not be challenged by the taxing authorities and that the company will not be subject to additional tax, penalties and interest as a result of such challenge.

The company has exempt organization tax filings open to Internal Revenue Service audit for years ending December 31, 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2024.

<u>Cash and Cash Equivalents</u> - For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the Company considers all highly liquid, short-term debt instruments purchased with a maturity date of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

<u>Restricted Cash</u> – Restricted cash consists of balances resulting from board designations restricted for specific purposes. As these purposes are not likely to be fulfilled within the operating cycle, they are classified as noncurrent on the statement of financial position.

<u>Donated Assets</u> – Donated investments and other noncash donations are recorded as contributions at their fair values at the date of donation.

<u>Investments</u> – Investments in equity securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets. Investment income and gains restricted by a donor are reported as increases in net assets without donor restrictions if the restrictions are met (either by passage of time or by use) in the reporting period in which the income and gains are recognized. Short-term investments consist of debt securities with original maturities of twelve months or less. Long-term investments consist of debt securities with original maturities greater than twelve months.

#### Note A – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

<u>Net Assets</u> – The Organization reports information regarding its financial position and activities according to two classes of net assets that are based upon the existence or absence of restrictions on use that are placed by its donors: net assets without donor restriction and net assets with donor restrictions.

Net assets without donor restrictions are comprised of funds whose use is limited only to the extent that the organization's by-laws limit the activities of the organization. Contributions with donor-imposed restrictions that are met in the same year in which the contribution is recognized are reported as net assets released from restrictions.

Net assets with donor restrictions are resources that are subject to donor-imposed restrictions. Some restrictions are temporary in nature, such as those that are restricted by a donor for use for a particular purpose or in a particular future period. Other restrictions may be perpetual in nature; such as those that are restricted by a donor that the resources be maintained in perpetuity. At December 31, 2024 the Organization had \$3,325 in net assets with donor restrictions. These net assets are restricted to be used for monitoring the levels of toxins and other pollutants in the rivers.

<u>Revenue Recognition</u> – Grant revenue resulting from exchange transactions is recognized when the related costs are incurred. Grants received in advance consists of grant funds that the Company has received but for which it has not incurred related expenses and/or satisfied the requirements of the grant agreements.

<u>Estimates</u> - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

<u>Concentration of Credit Risk</u> – The Organization maintains its cash and cash equivalents at financial institutions located in West Virginia. During the year, the Organization established an insured demand deposit account at one of the financial institutions it utilizes in order to maintain coverage from the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC). The insured demand deposit account has a pre-arranged function that can transfer funds from a deposit account to another account either inside or outside of the institution in order to maintain FDIC coverage. The Organization may exceed FDIC coverage on its other accounts during the year intermittently due to its operations.

<u>Furniture and Equipment</u> – Furniture and equipment are recorded at cost. Depreciation is computed using the double declining balance method over the estimated useful lives of the assets.

<u>Receivables and Allowance for Doubtful Accounts</u> – Accounts receivable are presented in the balance sheet at the time all the requirements for collection have been fulfilled. Grants receivable are recognized once notice of award is received and the grant objectives are substantially met and services have been provided. Management believes all receivables are collectible.

The Organization maintains additional are board designated rainy-day fund and an unemployment contingency fund in the amount of \$69,506 as of December 31, 2024.

#### **Note C – Subsequent Events**

The organization has evaluated all subsequent events through November 3, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued and it was determined that there are no subsequent events that require disclosure.

#### **Note D - Functional Classification of Expenses**

Directly identifiable expenses are charged to program and supporting services. Expenses related to more than one function are charged to program and supporting services on the basis of periodic time and expense studies. General operating expenses include those expenses that are not directly identifiable with any other specific function but provide for the overall support and direction of the Organization.

The Organization maintains a SEP/IRA retirement plan for full-time employees. Employees are eligible to enroll upon date of full-time employment. The plan requires annual contributions by the employer of 6% of each eligible employee's annual pay for the year ended December 31, 2024. Total expense for the year ended December 31, 2024 was \$30,564.

#### **Note F – Investments**

Investments are measured at fair value in the statement of financial position. The Organization considers the measurement of all investments to be a Level 1 measurement within the fair value measurement hierarchy. Level 1 inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities the active markets that the Organization has ability to access. #### Note G – Board Designated Endowment

As of December 31, 2024, the Board of Directors had designated \$69,506 of unrestricted net assets as endowment funds to support a rainy-day fund and unemployment contingency fund for the Organization.

The Organization's spending policy is at the discretion of the Executive Director or the Board of Directors.

To achieve the objectives of the Organization's investment policy, funds are held in an interest-bearing cash account.

#### Note H – Grants Received in Advance

During 2024, the Organization received restricted grants totaling \$1,119,835 that contained donor conditions. Since these grants were received with conditions on future uncertain events, they were not recorded as contribution revenue until donor conditions are met. Total funds received from donors in advance of the conditions being met totaled \$2,096,542; are recorded as grants received in advance; and will subsequently be recognized as contribution revenue when donor conditions are met.
